TOWARDS ADVENT – FESTIVAL OF CATHOLIC CULTURE: SATURDAY, 19TH. NOVEMBER

Come along to the **TOWARDS ADVENT** Festival at Westminster Cathedral Hall this **Saturday, November 19th**. Special guest speaker this year is Mgr. Keith Newton of the Ordinariate of Our Lady of Walsingham. There is also a celebration in film and drama of the life of Bl. John-Paul II. All welcome. The Festival opens at **10.30am** and runs all day, with stalls and displays from Catholic groups and organisations, refreshments, a play corner for children, books, DVDs, and all sorts of Catholic items on sale.

ALTAR SERVERS

As an experiment, any child who received their First Holy Communion this year (2011) who is interested in serving, will be considered for serving at the altar – the most important of all functions a lay person can offer in the liturgy. Normally it has been customary to wait for a year after receiving Holy Communion for the first time, but the parents of interested children are invited to leave their child's name and telephone number in the Sacristy before the end of this month. At present we have a large number of servers for the 9.30 Mass, where a rota will soon be introduced, but awkwardly low numbers for the other two Masses. More, and older, servers are urgently required, especially at 11.00 where their presence enriches the more solemn liturgy at that Mass.

At least one parent (or responsible adult) needs to be present and the sponsor (if possible).
